Outwood Post 16 Centre – 16-19 Tuition Fund Statement

2021-22 Academic Year

The purpose of this statement is to set out how Worksop Post 16 Centre will utilise the 16-19 tuition fund, in line with government guidance.

The Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA) has made a one-off funding allocation available nationally for the 2021 to 2022 academic year.

It is ring fenced for 16-19 education providers to support students who have yet to achieve a GCSE grade 4 in maths or English and to mitigate the disruption to their learning from the coronavirus (Covid 19) pandemic.

In response to this opportunity and to gain the greatest benefit and impact from these additional funds, eligible students are:-

- 1. Those who have not achieved a grade 4 in maths and/or English
- 2. Those who have an Education, Health Care Plan
- 3. Those with special education needs and disabilities (SEND) where disruption has impacted on their learning.
- 4. Those with an economic disadvantage including high achieving students.

The additional funding allocated will be used to:-

- 1. Provide additional teaching and learning opportunities for these students.
- 2. This will be for GCSE English and maths as well as their wider curriculum
- 3. Students will work in small groups
- 4. Bespoke resources will be purchased targeted in the catch-up sessions and used to support their learning
- 5. Our groups will remain small to ensure a more 1:1 approach so student learning can be maintained.
